

In the coming months, the Department of Education will send you 2 email communications for each of your children enrolled in Victorian government schools.

Please ensure that your child's 2025 enrolment is completed and that your contact information is up to date.

The 2 emails from the Department of Education will: 1. Confirm your email address between mid-October and late-November.

2. Provide you with your unique \$400 School Saving Bonus code by the end of November.

If you do not receive a confirmation email from the department by late-November, please check your spam or junk folders and contact the school office on 5144 5644 if needed.

Good Afternoon,

Just dropping you a note to ensure that you are aware that round 8 of the State Government's Get Active Kids Voucher Program is now open for applications. These vouchers are a case of "first in, best dressed" and will close as soon as allocation is exhausted.

Eligible families from your school may be able to claim a voucher or reimbursement for expenses incurred since 24 July 2024 up to \$200 per eligible dependant to assist with the cost of memberships or registration fees, equipment, or uniforms. Vouchers will have an expiry date of 29 April 2025.
